

Superyacht of the Week: DL Yacht's first Dreamline 34

Launched in summer 2015, the new *Dreamline 34* is the very first vessel in the Italian shipyard DL Yacht's 34 metre range. She features naval architecture by Giuseppe Arrabito of the fellow Italian company Arrabito Naval Architects, whilst Enrico Gobbi of the Dubai based company Team for Design undertook both her interior and exterior design.



Gobbi and Team for Design have created a sleek and sophisticated interior, which screams stylish opulence. A bright, crisp colour palette has been fully utilised throughout the *Dreamline 34*, with clean cream and white upholstery in the guest living and entertainment areas continued into each of the four generous guest cabins and main deck owner's suite. The brightness of the primary colours are counterbalanced with details of rich, chocolate and coffee coloured shades of brown, which creates a chic and warmly welcoming ambiance.





The owner's suite is flooded with natural light from the large windows surrounding the area - achieved from the single, long window running across the main deck - as well as the two large skylights positioned above the bed. The forward facing suite places the plush bed in the centre of the room, allowing the owner to wake up to spectacular views every morning. The area is made complete by the addition of a cream sofa, convenient and bright work space, and striking en-suite facilities.



The owner was reportedly very involved within the creative process when it came to perfecting the interior of the *Dreamline 34*, and a variety of luxurious materials have been throughout. One of the highlights of the owner's suite is the exclusive private access to the foredeck, a feature that is not often seen on yachts in this size range



The four remaining guest cabins are located on the lower deck, consisting of three double cabins and one twin. A clear design motif has been continued throughout each of the cabins, and exudes the same welcoming, chic sophistication found in the owner's suite.





Each guest cabin comes with en-suite facilities, each beautifully decorated in marble with white onyx washbasins. A crew of five are also accommodated for on the lower deck.



Moving on to her saloon, the crisp and clean sophistication continues. Two large cream sofas sit adjacent to one another, flanked by cream and chocolate brown armchairs, all positioned around a unique coffee table on a soft carpet rug, offering guests the perfect setting to relax and socialise. Like the owner's suite, the saloon benefits from the aforementioned single window run throughout the main deck, and is bathed in natural light. For when the sun sets, however, Enrico Gobbi and his team have installed tiny LED lights in the ceiling, reminiscent of a starry night sky and contributing once again to that welcoming ambiance.



The formal dining area features an immediately eye-catching large glass table framed in wenge, seating ten guests comfortably in cream upholstered seats. The lighting feature positioned directly above the dining table is a hand-crafted masterpiece in glass, brought to life by the northern Italian brand, Barovier & Toso.



One of the best things about the dining area, however, is most certainly the fold down balcony, which is situated completely in line with the table, which, upon extension, offers guests a tangible connection with the outdoors whilst enjoying a fine dining experience inside. The attention to detail and level of furnishing in general truly makes it clear that with the *Dreamline 34*, DL Yachts desired to create a yacht finished to a standard far above what is commonly available on the market today.



Moving on to her outdoor spaces, the spacious sundeck is an area completely dedicated to the entertainment of guests. This area features a special glass Jacuzzi, complete with a waterfall feature and surrounded by sun loungers for when guests wish to do nothing more than simply bask in the sun. The aesthetically pleasing Jacuzzi feature continues the high levels of chic design as seen in all other areas inside the yacht.

The sundeck also incorporates a Teppanyaki grill and lobster tank. The heated, fresh lobster tank guarantees guests the opportunity to catch fresh fish and other crustaceans themselves, enjoying the fruits of their labour afterwards. Covered by a hardtop with sliding panels, this area is completed with an al fresco dining area and further lounging area. A five metre Williams Dieseljet tender and hydraulic crane are found on the lower deck.



In regards to her performance, the *Dreamline 34* is powered by twin MTU 12V 2000 engines, providing her with a maximum speed of up to 22 knots, and a cruising speed of 20 knots. At a speed of 12 knots, she has a range of 3,500 nm. The *Dreamline 34* is the largest vessel to be completed by DL Yachts, and follows the completion of the 26 metre vessel they launched in 2014.
